## CALL FOR PAPERS

The **27**<sup>th</sup> **Colloquium on Pensions and Retirement Research** will be held this year on **2-3 December 2019** at Colombo House Theatres, UNSW Sydney.

The Colloquium, co-hosted by <u>CEPAR</u> and the <u>School of Risk & Actuarial Studies</u>, <u>UNSW Business School</u>, is a unique annual event, bringing together academics, government and industry to discuss the latest research on pensions, superannuation and retirement.

The theme for 2019 is 'New Developments in Pensions and Retirement'.

In the interest of highlighting the theme we specifically invite submissions on the following topics:

- Retirement benefits, demand and design
- Regulation and performance of superannuation and pension funds
- Member engagement
- Choice architecture and defaults
- Health and aged care costs
- Housing and retirement, including reverse mortgages

Contributions are also welcome on other topics, which may include but are not limited to:

Public pensions; sustainable fiscal policy; taxation of pensions; inequality and pensions; financial product disclosure; financial literacy, financial education and financial advice; fintech solutions; cognition and financial decisions of the elderly; investment strategies for superannuation and pensions; retirement planning; demographic trends; retirement saving adequacy; the labour market for older workers; longevity and healthy life expectancy; gender issues in pensions and retirement.

International contributions are welcome.

Early career researchers, especially PhD students, are particularly encouraged to submit. A cash prize will be awarded for the 'Best Paper by a PhD Student'.
